The EU Feed & Food legislation

- Getting access to the EU market
- The authorisation determines if and how the product can be marketed
- Legislative context has taken a prominent place in companies' product strategy

Determining product legal status

Feed additive?

(1831/2003)



Feed material?

(767/2009)

Not a "free choice"
Product status is determined by legal definitions
Appropriate positioning of the product



Help for product positioning

Guidelines 2011/25

Commission Recommendation on guidelines clarifying the distinction between feed materials, feed additives and other products (biocidal porducts, veterinary products,...)

Dossier Strategy

Start by the end: the Annex entry

- Identity / expected details
- Holder-specific or not
- Category / functional group
- Type of use / further qualifications
- Etc.

Build application dossier on the basis on how the final authorisation should look like



Dossier Strategy

- Basis for application is Regulation 1831/2003 (authorisation criteria and procedure)
- Regulation 429/2008 (detailed rules for presentation of application and assessment)
- EFSA administrative guidance for preparation of technical dossier
- Other sources of inspiration: EFSA technical guidance (e.g. guidance zootech additives), report on previous applications, etc.





Expectations and Innovation





Innovation

- Steady state is no option
- Need for a playing field
- Transparency (economic planning)
- Return on investment



Innovation dynamic is fragile.

Threats:

- Uncertain legal environment
- Unfair enforcement
- EFSA



Specialty Ingredients at the core of feed chain innovation



- Productivity only one aspect
- Safe / Wholesome / economic / sustainable / ethic / healthy Animal Products
- Phytogenic ingredients
- Enzymes
- Sensory additives
- Probiotics
- Organic acids
- ...
- Lack of openness at EFSA level
- Support by EU Commission (e.g. mycotoxin inactivators) but overlap risk assessment risk management



Functionality, claims and legislation

Feed industry values.

- Provides basic nutrition
- Provides functionality

Both contribute to sustainability, profitability and societal expectations towards livestock production

- Introduction in EU legislation of claims on compound feed and ingredients is a positive move (Reg. 767/2009)
- Delicate area: requires fairness and transparency



Functionality, claims and legislation

Feed additives

- Functionality under 1831/2003
- Substantiation under 429/2008
- Claims not regulated


Feed Materials

- Claims under 767/2009
- Substantiation not regulated (general orientation)
- Functionality not Regulated

Compound feed

- Claims under 767/2009
- Substantiation not regulated BUT Industry Code Good Labelling
