

2015 – Project

Animal welfare must be adressed during live animal transport.

There was a need to facilitate the understanding and practical implementation of Regulation 1/2005 on the transport of animals in Europe.

Objective

- ✓ Develop guides for good practices for all types of animal transport
- ✓ Homogenize the implementation of Regulation 1/2005

Method

representatives of EU stakeholders


5- Impact assessment questionnaire

≈ 39 % are interested to do more and could use the new guidelines


≈ 17 % already apply more than the EU rules, but are interested to learn about other practices
