


Workshops: Economic sustainability aspects mentioned





CONCLUSION



- For farmers: environmental & economic aspects most important
- For stakeholders (workshops): social & animal-related issues in some countries most important
- Differences between countries could also be due to different interviewers / workshop leaders
- Views of pig farmers and other stakeholders: more similar than might be expected
- Animals (pigs) broadly addressed in the integrated assessment, but also all other sustainability dimensions
- Nearly all aspects from national workshops and farmer interviews are addressed in the integrated assessment method with > 160 indicators
