










- Enable a culture of openness in dealing with unexpected and unintended events observed during video analysis
- Foster reflection, co-creation and application of ethical practice involving all persons engaged in a video-based animal study

Planning: the principles of privacy to prevent conflict

- Expectations and responsibilities regarding privacy should be made explicit
- Arrangements based on a shared and agreed moral frame of reference
 - In animal studies, a single focus on the prevention of privacy issues is not sufficient!





Running & reporting: the principles of research integrity to create a culture of openness

- Failing to notice, document and report a relevant observed object can be a case of ٠ questionable research practices, and thus a research integrity (RI) issue
- RI educational resources often deal with more general topics ٠



Raise awareness of the unexpected/unintended that may be observed

Create a culture of openness for discussion and reflection on the conflicts the observer may encounter



Adhering to the principles of RI arises from the purpose of science itself!


Practice outlined and guided by conversation



Discussion

- Practical implementations:
- a) Fostering systematic reflection on the interests at stake

- Awareness of the variables and dimensions of the study, their interrelationship and possible conflicts
- From early planning stages to publication of results
- Limitations:
 - Location- and time dimension
 - PIs are not always aware of the perceived dilemmas of the observers
 - Some research groups will already have established the concepts of systematic reflection and participation in their daily work



- Making 'contracts' with people involved, based on a shared moral frame of reference
- Inviting people to re-watch certain sequences



Outlook

- Develop educational materials based on the proposed framework: small videoclips, charts, factsheets etc.
- Foster an approach that is outlined and guided by conversation, and that leaves room for creative implementations of individual research groups
