What is self-organization?

Not to delegate to others what you can do or learn how to do yourself



In sport: autonomous practitioners outside institutions



In the equestrian field: riders, owners or keepers of equines who self-organize to manage their equines independently of any professional equestrian structure

- Grouped together or not
- Individuals or families
- Keeping equines for no economic gain







A research program on equestrian self-organization

Issues:

- A growing phenomena
- Little is known about these consumers
- Institutional detachment
- Lack of trust regarding professionals
- Risks concerning safety, health, welfare, environmental practices...
- Economic stakes





A **research program** to analyze self-organized equestrian user characteristics, reasons for self-organization, practices, needs, relations with professionals... and to propose an adapted service offering

First results: a potential market

- 90% of self organized users need services
- **93**% of professionals would be interested in developing an **offer** of services towards self-organized customers
- Few professionals currently propose services to these customers
- A gap between the offer and the demand
 - Online surveys among 337 self organized users and 233 managers of professional equestrian structures
 - Aim: compare the demand of these consumers (and their willingness to pay) with the interest of professionals in offering these services, and at what prices

4 main categories of services

Equestrian practices

Of interest for 76% of professional structures

Searched by 34% of self-organized users

- Coaching with an independant teacher (28%)
- Information on track marking (15%)
- Guided hiking (14%)
- Horse training (12%)

Agricultural services

Of interest for 10% of professional structures

Searched by 45% of self-organized users

- Plot maintenance (39%)
- Agricultural machinery renting (31%)
- Hay production (26%)
- Training about plot management (26%)

Daily care and management of equines

Of interest for 34% of professional structures

Searched by 43% of self-organized users

- Supervision (36%)
- Daily care (31%)
- First-aid training (17%) and other trainings
- Short-term livery services (12%)

Rental of specific infrastructures

Of interest for 62% of professional structures

Searched by 47% of self-organized users

- Indoor and outdoor schooling arenas (42%)
- Outdoor schooling fields (32%)
- Transportation equipment (28%)
- Storage areas (26%)

Exemples of services matching supply to demand

	Demand of self- organized users	Current offer in professional structures	Exemples of services 1 day hiking in group:
Equestrian practices	Monthly budget = 91€ for 2 sessions	1h teaching with an independent coach = 20 to 40 €	100€/pers Lesson with an independant teacher: 30€/h
Infrastructures	Monthly budget = 65€ for 5 utilisations	2h renting of training arena = 25 to 56€	2h renting of a training arena: 30€
Daily care and management	Monthly budget = 120€ for 6 services	2h supervision/home care = 58 to 99€	Supervision/care = 20€ for 1h/day
Agricultural services	Annual budget = 493€ for 3 services	Little offered	1 day training about plot management = 150€/pers
