- ✓ **Decree of the Ministry of Health of the 28 June 2022**: **Biosecurity** requirements for pig farms
- ✓ **Decree of the Ministry of Health of the 30 May 2023**: **Biosecurity** requirements for poultry farms

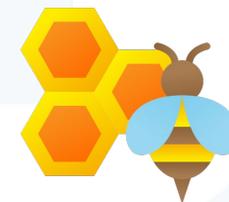

RESOURCE BASED FACTORS

Parameters linked to management and structures that can be associated with some negative welfare consequences



RESOURCE BASED INDICATORS MANAGEMENT + HOUSING



POOR

WELFARE CONSEQUENCES

Negative effect on welfare resulting from one or more environmental factors



ANIMAL BASED INDICATORS DIRECT + INDIRECT

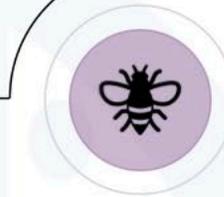

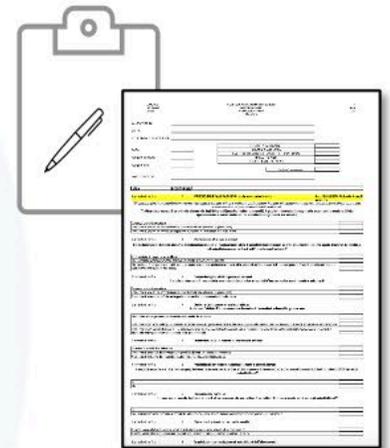

ANIMAL BASED FACTORS

Able to measure directly or indirectly negative welfare consequences of RBIs

The welfare assessment protocol



RBI

Number of hive inspections	
Hives are inspected less than once a month	POOR
Hives are inspected at least once a month during the inactive season and at least once a week during spring (this period may be extended to 15 days during the flowering season or if weather conditions do not permit). The inspection proceeds from strong colonies to weak/suspected diseased colonies.	FAIR
In addition to the criteria of the "fair level", the beekeeper records his/her notes	GOOD

Winter mortality	
> 20%	POOR
10%-20%	FAIR
< 10%	GOOD

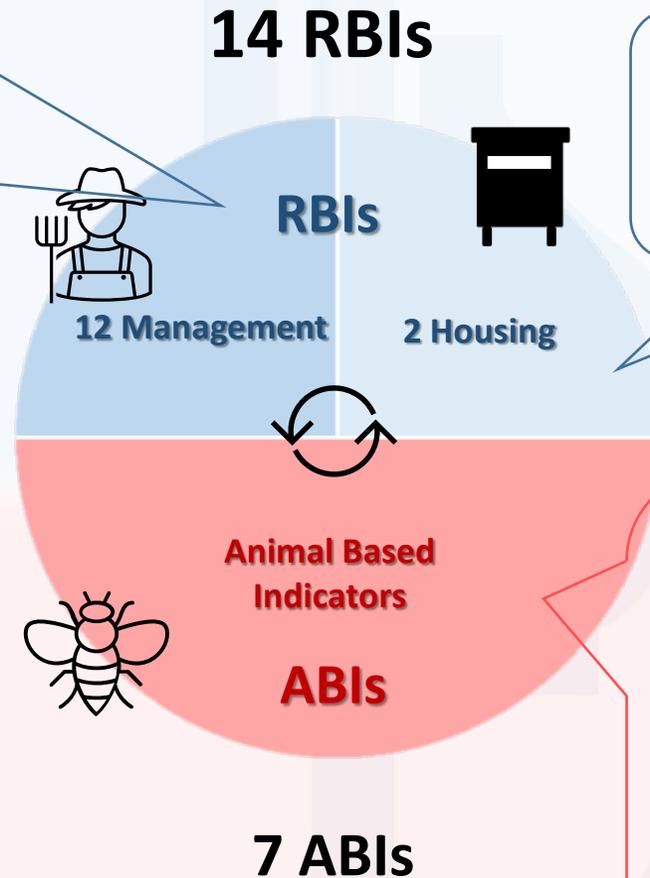
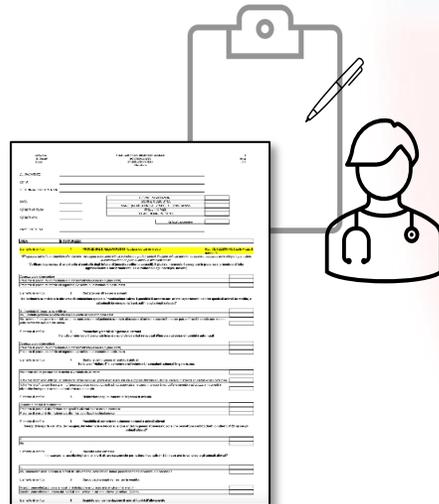


The welfare assessment protocol

1. Beekeeper training
2. Number of hive inspections
3. Colony equalization
4. Queen replacement
5. Queen selection
6. Artificial swarming
7. Feeding management
8. Management of hives affected by diseases
9. Anti-varroa treatments
10. Overwintering
11. Transport
12. Culling of the colony

13. Hive type and its level of maintenance
14. Hive position and orientation

1. Winter mortality
2. Abnormal colony depopulation/mortality
3. Robbing signs
4. Number of drone laying queen colonies
5. Number of queenless colonies
6. Irregular brood pattern
7. Clinical signs of varroosis



The biosecurity assessment protocol

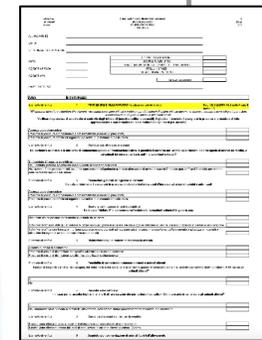
1. Right apiary identification
2. Identification of the single beehive
3. Apiary access control
4. Provision, control and hygiene of the personal protective equipment available to visitors
5. Control and management of new bees introduced into the apiary
6. Hive cleaning practices
7. Cleaning practices for work tools and personal protective equipment
8. Replacement of brood comb
9. Separate management of sick colonies
10. Origin of beekeeping equipment and wax
11. Waste material management
12. Varroa infestation monitoring
13. Presence of abandoned beehives, apicultural equipment or dead colonies in the apiary
14. Control of insects and rodents

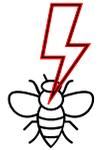
The welfare assessment protocol: **Criticities**



Adapting a standardized system to an extremely complex and still unknown species.



• Mechanisms governing insects' ability to suffer are still not deeply understood.



• Little knowledge of the ways in which insects communicate their suffering

• "Strong interconnection with the environment."



• High resilience



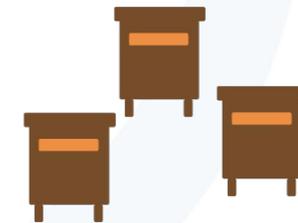
