
- Since 1974











Highly concerned overall 75%





FOOD FOR THOUGHT....



- ✓ Sceptical attitude (75%)
- ✓ Effective past campains of animal protection associations
- ✓ Dissociation: respondents' declarations vs. actual shopping habits (live animals vs. food; willingness to pay)
- ✓ Approach to animal welfare at a whole European level





FUTURE CHALLENGES...

- ✓ Effective and simple communication to the wider public, tailored to the socio-economic group???
- ✓ Companion and fur animals???
- ✓ Data on: actual knowledge, dietary habits and regious beliefs, income and family composition, sources of information, «drivers for shopping habits»
