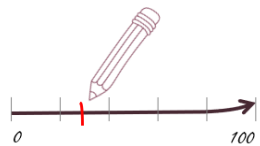
Dry matter content (%)

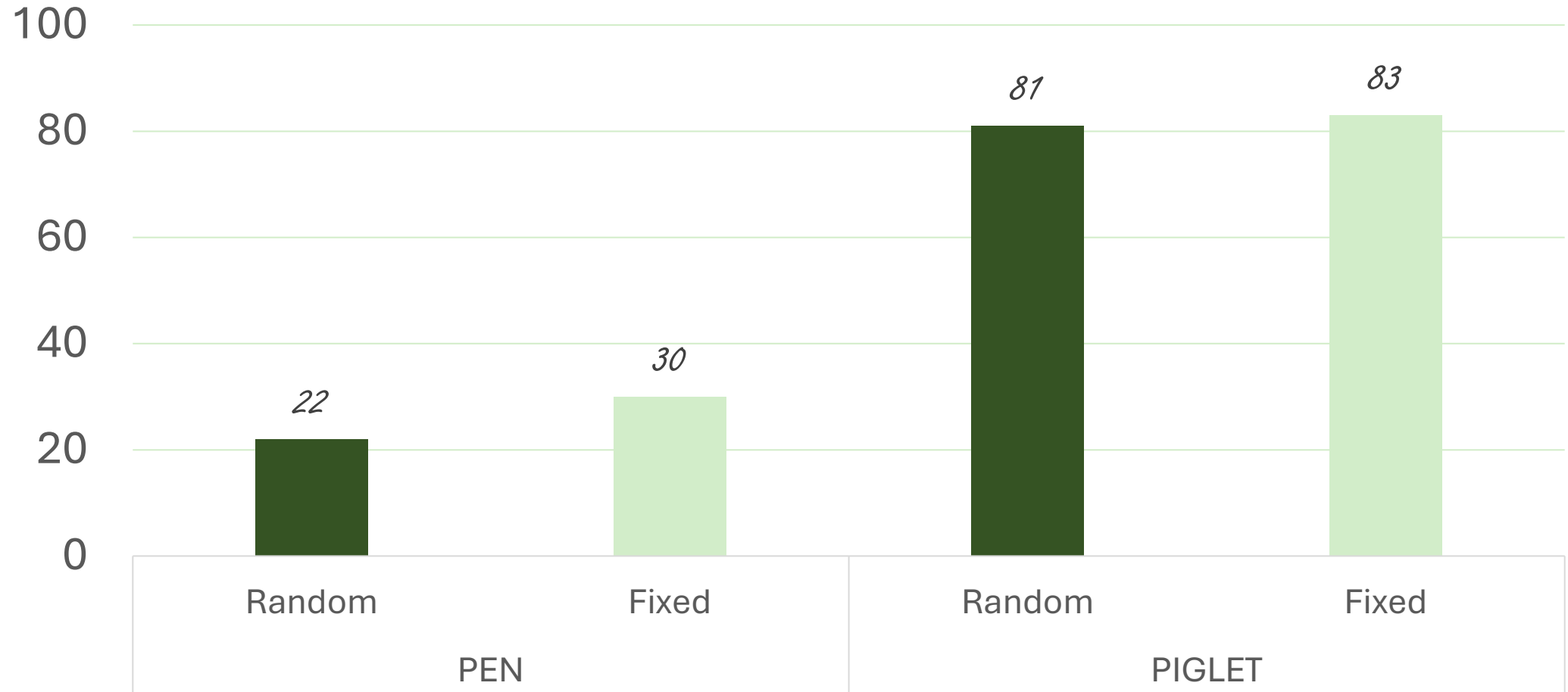

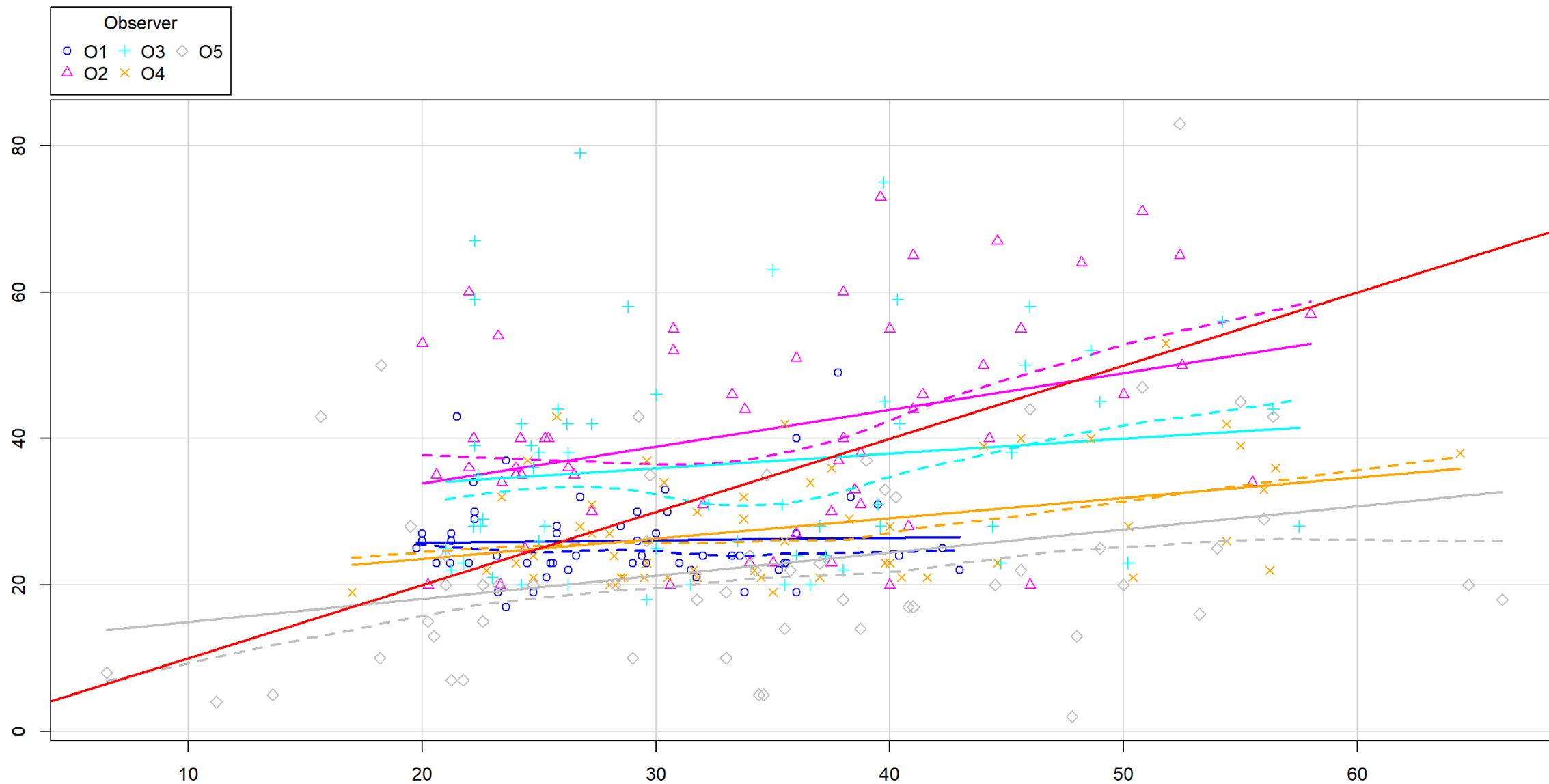


*Intraclass

CONCLUSIONS

- 1) Good relationship between FCS at piglet level and dry matter content
- 2) Poor relationship between pen and piglet level
- 3) The reliability of scoring at animal level is much higher – pen level more observer dependent

Score	1	2	3	4
Description	Firm	Soft and shaped	Loose (diarrhea)	Watery (diarrhea)
Picture				
Assessment	Sometimes, (almost) no material is deposited. Sometimes, firm and sticky feces, which may be in large quantities.	Fecal material is always deposited. A smooth/thin layer of soft feces, which are often of lighter coloration than score 1.	All of the cotton is colored with feces. The surface appears dull (less shiny than score 4). The cotton tip takes up lots of moisture.	No or only a small amount of solid material appears on the swab. The feces appear watery with a shiny surface. The stick is moist.
